PARK BY THE NUMBERS: The diverse and dynamic pursuits of our students

— and the lives of achievement, generosity, and joy once they leave Old Court Road — best represent the value of a Park education. Here are some numbers, too, that help tell the Park story:

PARK has grown and developed on 3 campuses since our founding in 1912 as a coeducational, non-sectarian, independent school.

Located at 2425 Old Court Road, and referred to as "a city school in the country," our roots remain firmly planted in Baltimore (the original campus was adjacent to Druid Hill Park) with a deep sense of engagement with, and responsibility to, the community in which we live.

Our 100-acre campus — located just 18 minutes from the Inner Harbor — is a thriving learning laboratory that includes woodlands, a pond and stream, an outdoor education course, trails, gardens, and more. We train and compete on our 9 athletic playing fields, including a state-of-the-art AstroTurf surface, and an NCAA regulation baseball field.

Our academic community itself is made up of 846 students, Pre-K through Grade 12, and a faculty of 108 full-time and 11 part-time inspired and inspiring teaching professionals.

88 Park faculty members hold master's or other advanced degrees, with 9 Ph.D.s, 1 Ed.D., and 1 J.D. among them.

Our teachers have an average experience of 21 years in teaching, with an average tenure of 11 years at Park.

Park's school-wide average class size is 15 students

— and we maintain a 7:1 student/teacher ratio.

Our community of lifelong learners — including students, teachers, parents, and grandparents — is active and engaged. We value, in particular, our strong relationships with our alumni, **71** of whom are current Park parents!

PARK BY THE NUMBERS, CONTINUED:

Our 170 new students in 2021 represent 20 percent of the Park student body and come from 69 different schools in 43 zip codes in and around Baltimore. 27 percent of our new students identify as people of color. A number of our students are already connected to Park: 38 join siblings already enrolled at Park and 27 follow in the footsteps of parents, grandparents, and/or family members who are proud Park alumni.

Park families come from many social, economic, racial, and religious backgrounds. Need-based Tuition Assistance is provided to more than a third of Park students -40 percent.

There is quantitative evidence that excellence is the natural outcome at Park. Though we don't teach to the test, 85 percent of AP test-takers from the Class of 2021 scored a three or better. On the SAT, the average score for Park's Class of 2021 test-takers was greater than 1300 — on a 1600-point scale; for the ACT, the average score was 30 - on a scale of 1-36.

Our students are well-rounded and engaged. 85 percent of Upper School students are enrolled in art courses. 64 percent of Upper Schoolers play on athletic teams. More than 65 student-led clubs and activities represent the passions and pursuits of our students — including beekeeping, Model UN, international aid, Asian culture, mock trial, music tech, ISAMR (International Student-led Arctic Monitoring & Research), and mentoring.
